

School Uniform, PE Kit etc.

At Long Furlong we have a school uniform which all pupils are expected to wear. Please label all items of school uniform with your child's name.

Grey skirt/trousers/shorts/culottes/pinafore dress
White blouse/polo shirt/shirt or a Burgundy polo shirt may be worn
Burgundy school sweatshirt/burgundy cardigan
Burgundy school hoody*
Socks/Tights (white, black or grey)
School shoes/sandals†

Summer option: pink & white dress

Items of clothing required for cultural or religious reasons (e.g.patka, hijab, kippah, etc) may be worn in school.

* Pupils are allowed to wear burgundy hoodies on the way to and from school, for outdoor morning and lunchtime play, for outdoor PE, for school sporting events and on school trips. Pupils are not permitted to wear hoodies in the classroom and should instead wear their school sweatshirt or cardigan.

Sweatshirts, cardigans, school hoodies and PE kit may be ordered from online from www.brigade.uk.com or from <https://myclothing.com/long-furlong-primary-school/5841.school> or you can find your own alternative supplier as uniform does not need to have a school logo. House T-shirts can be ordered direct from the school office.

†**Footwear:** should be shoes (*not* trainers) and be black, navy or a dark colour with enclosed heels and toes. Sandals may be worn in warmer weather, these can be black, navy or white with a secure strap. Heels should not be higher than 4cm. Please label your child's shoes with his or her name.

PE/Sport: Children should have black shorts and a plain or white T shirt or their House T shirt for indoor PE. In winter they will need to wear a warm top (school hoody or sweatshirt, or burgundy hoody/ sweatshirt) and jogging bottoms (plain black or plain dark coloured) but they must wear shorts underneath in readiness for indoor PE. Children with long hair should bring a 'tie' so that they are able to tie hair back during lesson.

Earrings/Jewellery: the children are discouraged from wearing jewellery to school apart from a wristwatch. Your child may wear a small stud or sleeper. However, it is important that, even with Reception age children, they are able to manage the insertion and removal of their earrings independently. If you feel that your child is unable to do this, please do not let them wear earrings to school. Following Local Authority health & safety guidelines, teachers will not remove children's earrings. During PE/sport sessions it will not be acceptable for your child to wear earrings unless they are newly pierced (within a seven-week period) in which case they will be covered with surgical tape.

Accessories: plain hairbands, clips and hair ties may be worn. We discourage hair braiding/beads. Pupils are not permitted to wear nail polish in school.
